Is My Child Gifted?

In order to assist you in the evaluation of whether or not a child would be considered as gifted, the following chart has been devised to help discriminate the differences between a "bright" and a "gifted" child. Although all students will exhibit a mixture of characteristics listed below, the gifted and talented child typically exhibits unusually high levels described in the gifted category.
